President's Report

I'm pleased to present the annual report for 2021 to members of the CSC in what has been a trying year given the lack of snow and lengthy Covid-19 lockdowns.

The Bad News

In addition to lockdowns, for the third year in a row there was a lack of early-season snow. Like 2019 and 2020, snow didn't arrive in great quantities until early-August, once again cancelling Derby, and just before nationwide lockdowns started, severely reducing our income for the remaining season.

Apart from being a great place to call home meet friends on the mountain, Christie is essentially an accommodation business, and the success of the club relies on the number of bed-nights we have during the season.

In 2019 we had c.1,900 bed-nights. Last year we had 20% fewer bed-nights, and this year was nearly half at 931. As a result, we incurred a deficit of c.\$20,000. Read more about this in the treasurer's report.

The list of disappointments this season also included:

- The entire mountain being closed for three weeks from mid-August to early-September
- RAL cancelling all on-mountain events for the season
- Mens' Few Days being postponed twice before going ahead with reduced numbers
- The Lodge opening late (third week of July) and closing a week early due to the warm weather and ensuing lack of snow.

In addition, we've decided to hold the AGM online for the first time ever, and tomorrow (26 November) a meeting of RAL shareholders will determine the company's ownership structure. We live in interesting times.

The Good News

Club events were remarkably successful for a season hampered by a lack of snow and lockdowns:

- We had a full house for a fun Mid-Winter Christmas celebration—thanks to Ella Buckley for her enthusiastic organisation of this revived annual fixture on the Club calendar
- The Derby Party was a great success—thanks to Rachel Ward for a huge effort!
- Ladies' Few Days squeaked in just before lockdown and was well patronised
- The Club races held 2 October were a roaring success on a perfect Spring day

- The Christiania Snowboard Team placed second in the Haensli Cup
- The Junior's Weekend was an outstanding success despite the weather—thanks again to Ella Buckley.

Improvements to the lodge and its operation were made pre-season:

- The new booking system has worked well and received positive feedback from members
- A new liner was installed in the "Centre" tank to stop the water loss experienced last year
- Two beautiful new commercial ovens were installed making Pedro one happy cook
- Fourteen comfortable new mattresses on the wide beds replaced the last of our old 1970s mattresses
