Give way to riders below.


Share the slopes and give each other space.

In the event of an emergency our assembly point is:

Race on Staircase Slopes = Assemble Shuss Haus

Unique Alpine risks

Avalanche risk.

RAL safety services will manage this risk.

Volcanic risk.

Volcanic mudflow (Lahar) travel in valleys primarily. Refer to Hazard Map over page. Move to high ground.

Alpine Weather.

All personnel on site must be suitably equipped for alpine conditions at all times

UV sun exposure is intense at altitude.

Sunscreen should be applied. Eye protection should be worn - goggles or glasses.

Icy conditions underfoot and on structures.

All personnel must have appropriate footwear and other personal protection such as helmets when appropriate.
