In the event of a race accident: Call for Ski Patrol.

All accidents, incidents and close calls are to be reported to the Derby Health and Safety officer.
Race volunteers/officials are identifiable in yellow Derby armbands

Emergency Assembly

In the event of an emergency our assembly point is:

- Race on Valley T = Assemble Knoll Ridge Cafe
- Race on Staircase Slopes = Assemble Shuss Haus

RAL Snow Code

1. Stay in control at all times:

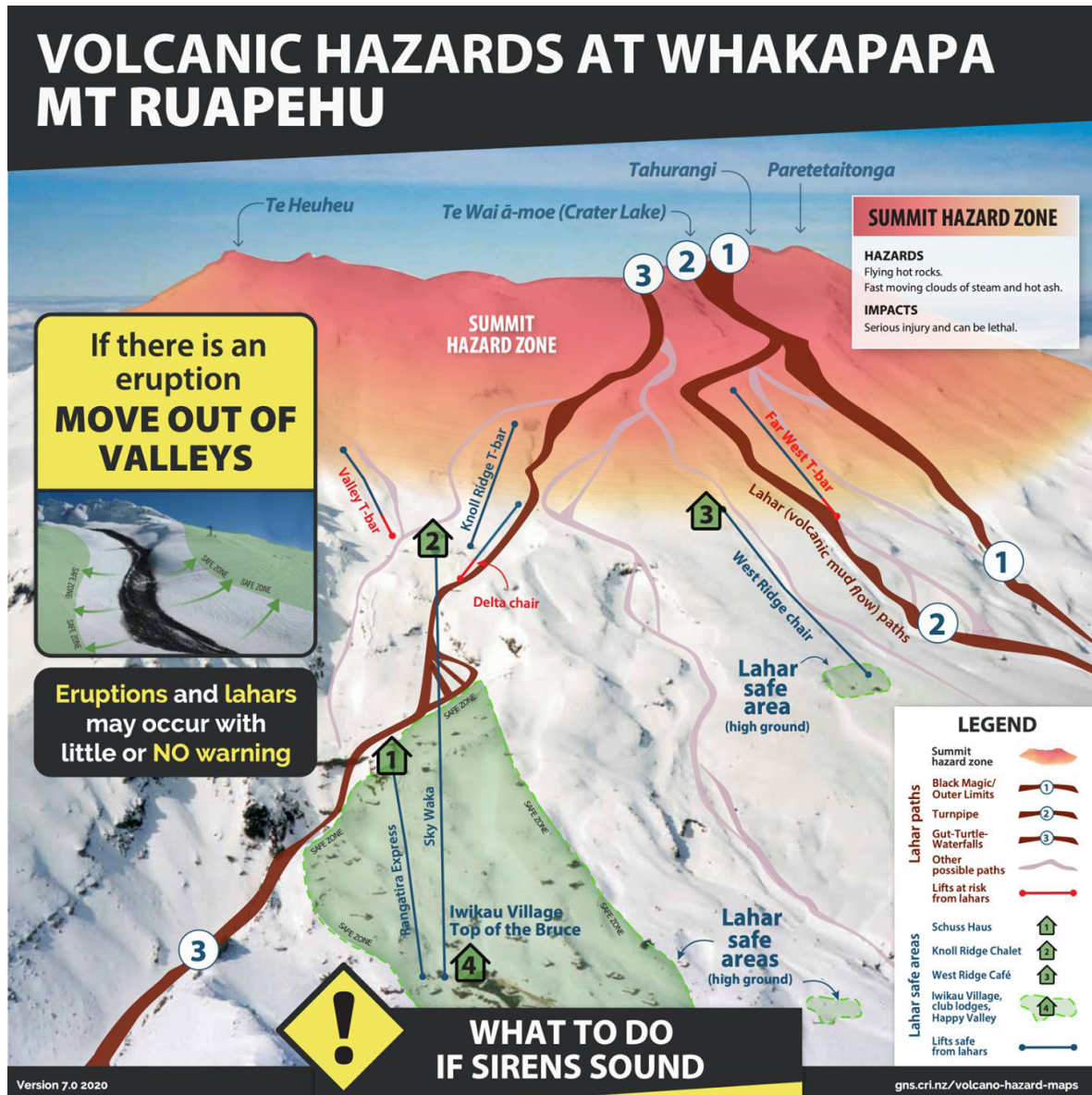
- Ride to the conditions.
- Control your speed.
- Don't lose what you use, your equipment or rubbish.

2. Respect gets respect:

- Give way to riders below.
- Share the slopes and give each other space.
- Obey ski area signage – it's for your safety.

Be aware of the unique Alpine risks

- **Avalanche risk:** RAL safety services will manage this risk.
- **Volcanic risk:** Volcanic mudflow (lahar) travel in valleys primarily. Refer to Hazard Map below.
- **Alpine Weather:** All on site must be suitably equipped for alpine conditions at all times
- **UV sun exposure is intense at altitude:** Sunscreen and eye protection: goggles or glasses.
- **Icy conditions underfoot and on structures:** All must have appropriate footwear and other personal protection such as helmets when appropriate.



HAZARDS

LAHARS PATHS: Eruptions generate lahars (volcanic mudflows) that can pass through valleys in the ski area.



HAZARD ZONE: During an eruption, flying rocks & fast moving clouds of steam and hot ash may occur.

IMPACTS: Serious injury and can be lethal.

Anywhere on this map is at risk from ashfall – this can obscure vision and make it hard to breathe.

IF YOU ARE:

IN A VALLEY

- > Move out of the valley to a ridge top.



IN THE HAZARD ZONE

- > Move down the mountain following ridges.



- ! If you see flying rocks, or a steam & ash cloud coming towards you, take shelter behind a bank or ridge and cover your head with your pack.

IN A BUILDING/CAR PARK/HIGH GROUND

- > Stay put and await instructions.

LAHAR WARNING SYSTEM

An Eruption Detection System (EDS) is operating in the ski area. The system will set off sirens and loudspeaker messages.

This map shows areas most at risk in a sudden eruption with little or no warning. Larger eruptions can and do occur. Volcanic activity and other unforeseen factors may alter features on this map, so safe and hazardous areas may change without notice.

ALL RACING RULES

Terms and Conditions:

- This event shall run on a weather permitting basis, on a course designated by RAL. If race conditions are deemed unsuitable, the event will be postponed to the contingency day (Sunday 7 September, 2025). If conditions are unsuitable on the contingency day, the event shall be cancelled or postponed. Any decision is at the sole discretion of the race organisers and is final.
- This event is entered on a non-liability basis and RAS/CSC accept no responsibility for any accident, incident or rewards relating to this event nor shall it be liable for any costs, expenses or damages which a club or any of its racers may incur through entering this race
- All competitors must run in bib order within their category, unless advised otherwise
- Category Order is to be advised at Registration
- Individual and team times shall be recorded and calculated as accurately as possible but RAS/CSC will not be accountable for any errors made.
- In the event of any awards being challenged the Race Captain must be advised immediately. RAS/CSC reserves the right to correct any placing, revising of results and recalling any awards to correct any inaccuracies.
- All decisions are at RAS/CSC's sole discretion and are final.
- No changes to teams shall be made after registration.
- Correct birth dates must be entered. If birth date is deemed incorrect, the racer shall be entered in the "Open" Category
- Snowboards must be of conventional style - Squalls and Mono skis do not qualify for prizes.
- Only one ski or snowboard professional is allowed per team, and professionals must also be full paid club members of their club. A ski professional is defined as a ski or snowboard coach, instructor or a paid member of ski patrol.
- All registration information provided must be true and correct to the best of each club's race captain's knowledge.
- The club's race captain is responsible to place all racers in the correct team categories.
- Racers under 16 years of age must have their guardian's permission to race.
- Any persons under 18 years of age must have a responsible guardian at the race after party, as RAS/CSC is NOT accountable for any alcohol consumption associated with this event. ID will be required for alcohol consumption.
- RAS/CSC reserves the right to take photos and/or videos of any racers involved in the race or at the awards ceremony.
- Each club and entrant acknowledges that RAS/CSC will be permitted to use these photos in any promotion of the event and that no royalties will be paid to entrants.
- Any person or team acting in a un-sportsman manner or failing to comply with any of the rules may be disqualified.
- The race event is smoke, drug and alcohol free
- Entry into this race is only upon agreeing upon each and all of these conditions.
